## Golf Croquet tutorial

Following on from last month's newsletter here are 3 more extracts from the official rule book.

 Before a player takes their turn all balls must have stopped moving.
It is preferable to replace a ball that leaves a boundary immediately so that there is no disagreement over where it left. If there is a disagreement it is the player whose ball it is who has the final say.
If more than one ball runs the hoop as the result of a single stroke (i.e) a jump shot, it is the ball that was nearer the hoop before the shot was taken that scores the point.
